The footage of all notebooks and items in the Berkeley Henley collection is approximately 9.0 lf. The first 16 listed notebooks, containing family data sheets, have been digitally recorded by Sue Bixby, with copies of those digital pictures burned to CDs. Steve Gauss, Kathy Kaldis and Sue Bixby have copies of those CDs. All 16 notebooks could be archived, although old photographs and news clippings are included in those notebooks which could be scanned from the original page for clearer copies than could be obtained from the CDs. All other notebooks may still be of use and should probably remain in the possession of the person responsible for database entry (Sue Bixby at the present time/Sep 2008).

The above notebooks total about 2 lf. and will be kept by Sue until she no longer needs them.

Other Harriman research collections:

<u>The notebooks of Louise (Harriman) Taylor</u> were, at Louise's request, placed by Sue Bixby with the New Hampshire Historical Society, Concord, NH, just before Louise's death in Feb 1993. Those notebooks include research that Louise completed over many years of study, plus correspondence and other items. Louise's sources include interviews with now deceased Harriman relations, plus visits to cemeteries, etc. She corresponded with Berk Henley and Sue Bixby, and other HFA members and shared her findings freely.

<u>Research papers of Ralph Harriman</u>, upon his death, were collected by the Napa Valley [CA] Genealogical and Biographical Society. The society was in contact with Sue Bixby in the winter of 2007/08, offering to send papers to whomever the HFA elected to receive them. The HFA offered to reimburse the society but later emails from Richard Bruechert of the society, Nvgbs@aol.com, indicated they had no time to go through the collection. It is clear they mean to extract anything of value and keep it at the society, leaving mostly Harriman paperwork that probably has already been shared with Berk Henley and Sue Bixby. It is probably not necessary to pursue possession of Ralph Harriman's research papers; he did a great deal of copying from online personal family trees and some of his conclusions were erroneous because he based them on these online family trees.

<u>Research papers of Joanne Harriman</u>, of Stoneham, Mass., if they have not been discarded, would be with one of her nieces or nephews. She offered to give them to Sue Bixby some months before her death but died unexpectedly before that transfer was made. These records could be of some value to the HFA in that she was the founder of the Association and kept notes of the early meetings, members, and correspondence.

A small box of Harriman papers and photos was passed to HFA member Allan Prince when he became HFA newsletter editor. He did not return those items when editorship passed to Heidi Harriman. These items are of limited value except for the photos donated by HFA members.
